TIFA ANNOUNCES WINTER/SPRING 2020 SEASON OF TORONTO LIT UP BOOK LAUNCH EVENTS

The first of 14 free public events will take place January 9, 2020

Toronto, January 9, 2020 – The **Toronto International Festival of Authors (TIFA)** today announced the winter/spring 2020 lineup of **Toronto Lit Up** book launch events, a multi-year joint initiative with the **Toronto Arts Council**. Between January to June 2020, Toronto Lit Up will deliver 14 free public events across the city to celebrate the release of 17 new books featuring 22 Toronto authors.
